Dear Parents,

November has been such an exciting month for our class. Thanksgiving is just around the corner, with this in mind, we have been busy making lots of fun art projects.

Some of the songs we have learned are: "Hello Mr. Turkey," "I'm a Little Turkey, My Name is Ted," "I'm a Little Indian on the Go," "Thanksgiving a Wonderful Time" and "Turkey in the Brown Straw."

Besides preparing for Thanksgiving, our class has recognized five new alphabet letters since the previous newsletter. The children enjoyed meeting Ms. A who goes "A'choo" all day. The children had fun making apples and sounding out words that began with the letter "A" as they put them into their aprons. Mr. B who has beautiful buttons was introduced and the children cut out blue letter B's and had fun decorating them with band aides, butterflies, bears and buttons.
